
Of those who pay rent, what percentage of your income do you pay on rent?


What percentage of income do you pay on rent?






To what extent do you think the housing crisis is an issue?








Do you feel that housing policy during the last 12 years of the Government has had young people in mind?

Qualitative answers: What do you think is the best solution to solve the Housing Crisis?


- 1. 'Reduce planning laws and planning requirements, allow building in the Green Belt.'
- 2. 'Cutting stamp duty, radically changing our approach to planning permission and pledging to build 'smart homes' instead of brick houses for state housing.'
- 3. 'Planning reforms similar to union action; in order to prevent housing you should be required to reach a fixed % of opposition to the housing within the local area i.e. 50% against, the development doesn't go ahead.'
- 4. 'Build beautiful homes.'
- 5. 'Build more on green belt, reduce immigration substantially.'
- 6. 'Price caps, rental reforms. More specialist lending from banks / lenders.'
- 7. Build more houses, especially council housing. Build higher in cities and on land close to things like train stations and shops. Introduce time limits on vacant land in prime locations to compel development.'
- 8. 'New towns e.g. Poundbury/Chapelton.'
- 9. 'Do everything Create Streets say. Regulations, rather than permissions based system, declassifying Green belt near stations.'
- 10.'Limit immigration and build more houses.'




Do you think MPs are aware of how the housing crisis impacts young people?


